In return you receive a pin and certificate with all that information on the certificate. THAT IS CHANGING!!! I now have to send you a blank certificate by e-mail which you in turn print and

then fill in the information. I've done it ONCE. This is new for all of us. It's going to take time and patience to get use to the new way.

The organization of the United Methodist Women came to recognize this dilemma when a plan for addressing social action issues was first developed. ALL issues could not be addressed. Focusing on a few current compelling issues seemed the solution. Even then the issues themselves may lead to other issues.

From 2020 to 2024 the focus selected for social action issues are: 1. Climate Justice and 2. Criminalization of Communities of Color and Mass Incarceration with a Campaign to Interrupt the School to Prison Pipeline.
