Greetings from Central Bay District

article, we have had a name change,
we are now known as United Women in Faith. Our
new name is part of a refreshment of our
organization that includes a new look, new feel and
new improved programs designed to better nurture
current members and welcome new women into our
sisterhood to put their love in action too.

As United Women in Faith we are a powerful, fearless force driven by God's love and united in sisterhood with a focus on women, children, and youth. We act for justice and transform communities. We invite United Methodist and other like-minded women to join us, because love and action can change the world.

Adopting the name **United Women in Faith** and introducing new and improved programs acknowledges the great changes that have occurred in the lives of U.S. women over the past four decades and in the ways they're engaging their faith. It acknowledges the changes you need to continue to grow in your faith and make the differences you want to make.

The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women, and expand options for membership and engagement. The new name also aims to welcome members whose local churches may choose to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church as well as women of other faith tradition who want to join.

We will maintain the legal name United Methodist Women while operating as United Women in Faith. You'll continue to see the name United Methodist Women used in some places, but as we move into the future, together we'll be United Women in Faith.

We remain the official women's organization of The United Methodist Church. We remain the organization training women for leadership, growing spiritually, transforming through education, providing opportunities for service, and transforming through education, and providing opportunities for service and advocacy. We remain women in mission who follow God's call for our time

Our new name lets women know they can remain a part of our organization, and it lets them know we will not leave them behind. It also lets the church know that we've been on a path of listening and discerning that will help us lead the church into its full potential.

The new mission statement for our organization: United Women in Faith seeks to connect and nurture women through Christian spiritual formation, leadership development, creative fellowship, and education so that they can inspire, influence, and impart local and global communities.

Our new logo features our new name of United Women in Faith next to a Christian cross in muted yellow, blue, orange, and green to reflect our forward-looking faith and the diversity of the organization and God's world. Treasurer

This is my 6th year as being a district treasurer, three with Blue Water and three with Central Bay. That is the

maximum number of years that anyone can be treasurer; so as of November 31st I will no longer be able to receive monies from your local United Women of Faith (UMF).

I would really urge all units to send me their monies as soon as possible as I have a great deal of book work to do in recording the funds that come in and making sure they get to the proper places.

I want to emphasize that all units that give at least \$5 in each of these four areas---pledge, gift to mission, gift in memory and world thank offering plus a \$40 gift to special mission recognition (SMR) will be recognized as a 5 STAR UNIT and receive a certificate to this effect at our District Annual Meeting. The SMR giving may be just a plain donation from the unit OR to recognize the special efforts of someone in your unit or congregation. That's a total of \$60 from your unit. An individual may do this too—give \$60 and they are considered a five star person. As of right now I have only 4 churches that qualify as 5 star units. They are Bay City Grace, Mount Pleasant, Rose City, and Weidman. I would very much like to add your church's name to my list. So please urge your treasurer to get your money in to me!

At our district meeting last October, Central Bay District made a pledge to the conference mission team of \$49,500. As of this date (June 12, 2022) I have collected \$11,600 and all of that has come from only 13 churches in our district. So if your church has not sent anything in to me for mission giving, I urge you to do so immediately.

We are starting to get back to normal and so I pray that your United Women of Faith (UWF) local unit is starting to have meetings again too. Many things are coming up in the district and conference as well. During August school of mission will take place at Lake Huron Retreat Center and then again in October at Gaylord First. We hope you will take advantage of these educational opportunities.

On October 1st our district annual meeting is to be held at Midland First. This is where certificates will be given out to all 5 STAR UNITS AND PERSONS. I pray your church is one of them.

On October 22nd the conference UWF will meet in Kalamazoo. Did you know that IF you are a district officer your expenses are paid to all of these events and if you drive there you are paid mileage too. Central Bay District has several openings for officers and we'd love to add you to our team. Please give it some serious consideration.
