I have attended exercise classes by Zoom! I have attended a family gathering by Zoom! I will be attending the Michigan Annual Conference by Zoom! I have attended a Mission u program by Zoom! And on and on. I also, have been wearing a face mask anytime I am with others outside of my family. Our church service has been conducted outside with masks and sitting 6 feet apart. And with the impact of the flood in my community, I find myself often saying, "How can we get there from here, with all of the bridges destroyed?"

In light of the safety concerns, the Central Bay District Annual Celebration will be held by **Zoom**. We are in uncharted territory. There will be no registration fee, but we are asking you to send in your offering. On October 3, we are inviting you to join us with your computer, cell phone or tablet. The process is relatively simple. You will receive an invitation to join the Zoom

meeting after you have registered. On Oct. 3 you will click on the link and your device will take you to the meeting. It should be just that simple! If you are unsure of how to do this, please call me or any other officer and we will walk you through the process. I am also willing to set up a trial meeting with you ahead of time. If you do not have a computer, cell phone or tablet ask a friend if you can join them at their home. It will be a fun watch party! I am looking forward to meeting with all of you on Oct. 3 for our first ever Zoom meeting and second annual Central Bay District Annual Celebration.

At the meeting we will have almost all the elements that we have had in person, including music, special speakers, the annual business meeting, and induction of officers for next year. Our speaker will be our own Linda Darrow, president of the Conference UMW. We will try to fit all of this in between 9:30 and 12:30. So, get your cup of coffee or tea and your favorite muffin, bagel or doughnut and join us for something we have never done before.

I have one more request. Are you able to join the District Leadership team for next year? Or do you know someone else who would be a good candidate? The nominations committee is still looking for people to join the slate of officers. I will not tell you that you will not have to do anything, but none of the work is terribly difficult and we work together as a team to get it done. I would love to talk with you about serving.
