

- Encourage critical thinking about issues facing humanity today.
- Grow in understanding of Scripture as it relates to Christian faith in contemporary life.
- Enhance self-knowledge and act from that knowledge.
- Strengthen involvement in local and global Christian mission.

This year there are several fantastic book titles and topics to choose from in the areas of Education For Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing For Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth. There are books for youth and children too. Many books are available in print and Kindle formats as well as large-print.
