Information About the Reading Program...

The purpose of the reading program is to better understand and participate in God's mission today to increase sensitivity to all human beings, to explore contemporary issues and to enhance and act on self-knowledge. It doesn't matter what your reading level is there are books for you. There are books for children, youth and adults. There are nonfiction books, novels, books of poetry, and books with just stunning pictures. Some books will make you angry, some will make you smile, and some books will make you want to take action.

Many of you were able to pass the quarantine time this past year reading so I anticipate a rise in our reading program reporting. Certificates will be handed out at our District Annual Celebration on October 2^{nd} at the Allegan UMC.

READING PROGRAM PLANS

Plan I: Read 5 books a year, one book from each category Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, Spiritual Growth and regular reading of Response magazine.

Plan II: Read 10 books a year, two books from each category Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, Spiritual Growth and regular reading of Response magazine.

Plan III: Read 15 books a year, two from each category Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, Spiritual Growth, plus 5 additional books from any category. Regular reading of Response magazine.

Plan IV: Read 20 books a year, two from each category Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, Spiritual Growth, plus 10 additional books from any category. Regular reading of Response magazine.

Plan V: Read 25 books a year, two from each category Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, Spiritual Growth, plus 15 additional books from any category. Regular reading of Response magazine.

Selections can be from 2016-2020 Reading Lists if not included in previous reports. Bonus books and Faith Talks count as 2 books.

Membership Nurture & Outreach: Maintains membership lists, develops ways to attract, welcome and maintain new and current members.

Social Action: Bring justice issues of concern to women, children and youth to the attention of the units; facilitate advocacy action planning; promote the United Methodist Women social justice priorities.

Program Resources: Promotes the UMW Reading Program to our District via articles for the *Compass*, public service announcement at events, prepares & presents certificates of recognition for women who have successfully completed the reading program.

All positions are elected for 1 year, with a maximum of 4 years in that position.

Training for these positions is provided by the district. Fees for attending Mission u, District Annual and MI Conference Annual are paid for by the District. Mileage to District Team meetings is reimbursed.
