CARSON CITY UMW ACTIVITIES

The UMW of Carson City UMC membership is 28. These are divided into 2 circles; the Wesleyan Circle and the Dorcas Circle. One of the local programs that we support is the IM 3rd Meal. Over 500 bag lunches are produced daily for food insecure children in the Ionia and Montcalm Counties. We support this program financially and by collecting food and volunteering. Carson City also has a food bank which we support financially and by collecting food. Five times a year we hold a Soup Luncheon as a fund raiser. It has become a town event with many using the time to connect with friends and family. The circles sponsor a Compassion International child and take turns writing to Amani, our child, monthly. Funeral dinners are put on for those requesting them. Coats, hats, mittens, sweat pants and underwear are given to the elementary schools depending on their need. This year, money and supplies were given to Dorothy Frederickson, a retired missionary to Haiti. Babies are put on a pile of rags on the floor with someone to watch for spiders and snakes and other harmful pests. Dorothy started a program where mothers who have gone through a birthing and child care class receive a "box" with a mattress inside along with a blanket, sheets, onesies, diapers, pins, dental floss to tie the cord with, soap, hat, etc. Our UMW



also supports the local women's crisis center known as RAVE.

The special offering came to \$981.00 to be given to The House of Promise in Lansing, which Shari Montgomery started for women who have found themselves in trafficked situations and want to get out. Shari told us about a few of the women they have served since opening earlier this year. Overall, this was a successful and fun day.

PURPOSE OF UNITED METHODIST WOMEN



- · Please accompany all checks with a form. These can be downloaded at www.unitedmethodistwomen.org. Once there click on For Members & Leaders. Then click on Roles & Responsibilities. From there click on Local United Methodist Women. To the right (in blue) you will see the Treasurer's Remittance Forms and Login. For those who don't have access to a computer, perhaps someone at your church could download some for photocopying. If this is not an option, contact me and I will get you some. When ordering a Special Mission Recognition Pin and Certificate, the amount owed is located on the bottom of the Special Mission Recognition form. This is usually the "basic" at \$40.
- · Please do not make checks out to me, Jackie Ricketts or Michigan Conference. Checks should be made out to Michigan District. I will make sure the money is sent on to the conference in a timely manner.
- · All remittance forms must arrive to me by December 5 as I have a deadline to the conference of December 12. Unfortunately any received after that date will be submitted the following year.
- · If a representative from your unit was unable to attend the Mid-Michigan District UMW Organizational Meeting and Celebration on September 19, where pledges were received for 2019, please contact me with yours as soon as possible. This is very important for planning the budget at all levels of United Methodist Women.
