WHAT DID WE LEARN?

The year 2020 was unique, to say the least. Is there anything to be learned from the challenges we faced? Maybe we learned way back in March that life, as we knew it, was changing. We were required to stay at home, except for essential livelihood activities for a couple of weeks that turned into several weeks, and here we are months later, learning how long and extended the changes have been.

We have learned that scientific predictions were right in warning of an upswing in the spread and resultant deaths in the fall and winter. We learned that it was safest not to gather for traditional Thanksgiving celebrations, and were warned that gatherings for Christmas were risky. And, above all this, we learned to wear masks, wash our hands frequently, and social distance. We also learned about the sacrifices and risks to first responders, medical professionals, and other essential workers. Some of us have experienced it first-hand or know friends and acquaintances who have had the virus. We have empathized with families who can't visit their loved ones in hospitals, assisted living residences or rehabilitation venues. We can understand, if we haven't personally experienced, how devastating it is to not be allowed to comfort those sick and passing away alone. Our hearts break with compassion and understanding.

Yet, there is HOPE. We are excited that scientists have been able to develop vaccines that are already being distributed in Great Britain and in America. While some of us have come to enjoy the changes the pandemic created, most of us long for a return to normal (even though we may not ever know our previous normal). HOPE is ours. Even though we are stressed and worry about the future, let's not let it diminish our HOPE. Jesus renews our HOPE whenever we seek him. Much of our world today lacks HOPE. Our challenge is to remind ourselves that Jesus came to bring HOPE; that He is our HOPE and that our HOPE is alive.

What did we learn in 2020? I pray that we learned to keep HOPE alive in our thoughts, actions and deeds, and that in 2021 we will face our challenges knowing that HOPE is ours through Jesus Christ. Please stay safe and healthy throughout the New Year.

Spiritual Growth is a goal throughout the UMW organization, for all of it's members. The opportunities for spiritual growth include, but are not limited to, programs and functions given at the local level. The "Program Book" can assist in developing a presentation on different subjects for a unit or circle meeting. There is an ongoing Reading Rrogram, that includes several new books annually. I even spent a number of years as the Department's representative on the Michigan State Housing Development Authority board, advocating for children's play areas in new housing developments. I've been retired since 2002 but the treatment of those families and individuals who Christ leads us to help will always be of concern. I hope my background will help me bring your attention to those issues and people who can benefit from our mission work in the coming years.
