## **IMMIGRANTS AND REFUGEES**

## DO YOU KNOW THE DIFFERENCE?

There is a lot of talk about immigration at our southern border. Do you support immigration or oppose it? Can you explain how immigrants and refugees differ?

- 1. Immigrant: an individual who leaves one's country to settle in another. Immigrants move by choice and due to promise of a better life. The main reasons include better economic conditions, education and family reason. However, they still have a choice to return to their own country at any time.
- 2. **Refugee:** an individual who moves out of one's country due to restriction or danger to their lives. Refugees move out due to fear or persecution caused by war, violence, political instability, aggression or due to their religion, beliefs, caste, or political opinion. In most cases, it is not possible for them to go back to their country.

## What does the United Methodist Church say about immigration and immigration policy?

From the earliest days, humans have been migrants. There is no one universal reason for migration, but the movement from one place to another is often fueled by the promise of a better future in the new location.

Refugees immigrating to the United States are often fleeing war, economic scarcity, persecution, the effects of globalization, and many other causes.

Roughly 11 million undocumented people live in the United States. They pay US\$12 billion in payroll taxes annually, according to the Social Security Administration. That doesn't count how much they pay in other taxes, like property

and sales taxes. Meanwhile, the United States spent more that <u>US\$18 billion</u> on immigration enforcement in 2012 alone. Unauthorized immigration to the U.S. is part of a larger global migration crisis. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees has estimated that 65.3 million people were displaced from their homes by conflict and persecution in 2015.

UNITED METHODIST SOCIAL U.S. policy has focused on enforcement, rather than addressing the root PRINCIPLES,  $\P162.H$  causes. It is time to focus on holistic reform. We affirm that God's love knows no human boundary. Let us put our faith into action.

## What the Bible and The United Methodist Church Say:

Throughout the Bible, God's people are called to love migrants. From Genesis to Revelation, we see that God desires that we help the most vulnerable in our midst, especially the sojourner. Hebrews tells us that in opening our homes to

guests, we may be "entertaining angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13:2)

his earthly life fleeing to Africa as a refugee in Egypt. (Matthew 2:13-18) Jesus says that to welcome the sojourner is to welcome him. (Matthew 26:35)

The United Methodist Church states that "at the center of Christian faithfulness to Scripture is the call we have been given to love and welcome the sojourner. We call upon all United Methodist churches to welcome newly arriving migrants in their communities, to love them as we do ourselves, to treat them as one of our native-born, to see them in the presence of the incarnated Jesus, and to show hospitality to the migrants in our midst, believing that through their presence we are receiving the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ." (Book of Resolutions, 3281)

## What You Can Do:

- Celebrate Migrants Sunday in your church on the first Sunday of Advent.
- Join the Rapid Response Team. The RRT is a network of over 300 United Methodists across the US who are working for immigrant and refugee justice. The RRT receives action alerts, policy analysis, resources for immigrant and refugee communities, and more from advocacy and organizing staff at Church and Society. The RRT also connects United Methodists doing this work to each other to network, support immigrant and refugee communities, advocate against unjust immigration policies and practices, and lift up one another in prayer, resourcing, and work throughout the connection.
- Build relationships locally between immigrants and nonimmigrants. Have your church become an <u>Immigrant Welcoming Community</u>. (UMC General Board of Church and Society)
- Connect with your local <u>Sanctuary Movement</u>.
- Support your local <u>Justice for Our Neighbors</u>, a United Methodist immigration legal aid organization. If there's not one in your area, start one!

## **Justice for our Neighbors:**

Those of you who attended the United Women in Faith Annual Celebration in Kalamazoo in October were treated to a presentation from two Michigan attorneys who work for JFON, a United Methodist Immigration Ministry non-profit that provides pro bono immigration legal services to low-income immigrants (including refugees) living in Michigan communities. They have offices in Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, Metro Detroit and Traverse City and can use volunteers both to help clients fill out paperwork and to provide office assistance. They are available to speak at events to help spread the word about their services and the experiences immigrants are having as they try to navigate the US immigration laws. Those attending annual conference donated over \$1,000 to help in their work. You can learn more and support this United Methodist ministry on their website at jfonmi.org.







## **BOOK REVIEW**


## LOVE IS THE WAY: HOLDING ON TO HOPE IN TROUBLING TIMES BISHOP MICHAEL CURRY

Walk the path of love with one of the warmest, most beloved spiritual leaders of our time, and learn how to put faith into action.

As the descendent of slaves and the son of a civil rights activist, Bishop Michael Curry's life illustrates massive changes in our times. Much of the world met Bishop Curry when he delivered his sermon on the redemptive power of love at the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle at Windsor Castle.

Her he expands on his message of hope in an inspirational road map for living the way of love, illuminated with moving lessons from his own life. Through the prism of faith, ancestry, and personal journey, "Love Is The Way" shows us how America came this far and, most important, how we can go a whole lot further.

The way of love is essential for addressing the seemingly insurmountable challenges facing the world today: poverty, racism, selfishness, deep ideological divisions, competing claims to speak for God. ## THE AGING OF AQUARIUS: IGNITING PASSION & PURPOSE AS AN ELDER HELEN WILKES

I found a book that I have used as a guide, even before it was placed on our current book reading program. I also don't like it when my son calls me an elder.


Your career has wound down, the kids have moved, and your schedule is clear for the next 30 years, at least.

In your youth, you cared about people and planet Earth, and you had grand visions of changing the world. At some point, those passions and that sense of purpose got buried under diapers and the 9-5. Yet that old you is still alive and you now have the time to make this next stage of your life the most powerful yet. But where to start?

Helen Wilkes, a retired professor and activist, takes readers on an inspiring journey to find renewed purpose in retirement. Along the way, she helps readers navigate the transition to a post-work identity by fanning the embers of lost passions and new interests.

Whether you are drawn to gardening clubs, to social justice issues, political campaigning, ethical investing, or creativity through the arts, "The Aging of Aquarius" offers inspiration, practical steps, and extra resources to help re-ignite your passion, your sense of purpose, and to effect real change in the world as an empowered elder.

Helen Wilkes, Ph.D. is an energized octogenarian who survived a lifetime of hardships ranging from fleeing Nazi Germany as a child to navigating personal and professional obstacles as an adult. Helen is author of the award winning book "Letters From The Lost" and lives in Vancouver, Canada.


How to Save Our Planet (YouTube video). Search on this category and you will also find a number of "nature documentaries" to follow up on the suggested watch listing. This first one gives historical aspect (<a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0Puv0Pss33M">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0Puv0Pss33M</a>)

I find that most of the interesting articles and videos in the daily Facebook feed; then I go back and research what else is written using specific keywords in the article: glass recycling, no-waste packaging; ocean plastic clean up machinery are a few examples. I try to write articles with a view towards something that can be done now, by one or more people; not just recycling, but sustainable effort. For instance, the lady in New York whose entire unrecyclable waste for a year fit into a quart jar.

To not waste time & resources, I also check Amazon's book review on other platforms and check how they are received (stars) and to get to a fuller explanation of the book's purpose, though I buy most from Thriftbooks.com — all books are preowned and if you buy \$15 in books, shipping is free.

If looking up Bible references, stewardship is a good search word. There are many books on the subject available through library/loans or Thriftbooks.com (another example of recycling). Checking on your local recycling facilities or waste pickup/collecting facilities for tours and information can be helpful for articles.


## **COOKIE WALK**
