We also continue to provide youth programming, bras, and basic health kits. One of my special times was at the Independencia UMC when

Peace in the midst of the storm. Plans are underway for a Peruvian youth leadership trip in 2019 with teams returning in 2020 for two mission experiences.

### 2018 READING LOGS DUE BY AUGUST 31ST








