A REFLECTION: TAKE TIME TO LOOK FOR GOD'S PROVISIONS

How are you? By any chance are you feeling malnourished? Oh, I don't mean in a physical sense. With the bounty of Michigan fruits and vegetables at this time we can't have a lack of good and good-for-us things to eat. I'm thinking of being underfed in a spiritual sense. I appreciate the on-line worship services of my church and of other churches.



In fact I get to participate virtually with congregations I would never be able to otherwise visit. Our pastor is doing a twice daily devotion on Facebook. Another group of Michigan clergy is presenting Extraordinary Connection daily devotionals, again online. These are very meaningful. But, it isn't like taking these in with others as in a Bible Study, Christian Education class or in-person worship. The presence of others strengthens the message for me.



KNITTED TOGETHER FOR GOD'S GOOD WORK!

Greetings to all of you in the Midwest District. I am Judy Huynh, your Mission Coordinator for Education and Interpretation. I am a member of the LeValley United Methodist Church, near Ionia. I am particularly excited this month to have my youngest son and his wife visiting us from California, having moved there from Seattle in July. They will be here until they can move into their newly purchased home in Vallejo, California, on September 8th. They are both great cooks, so we are eating really well, and we're loving it!



I recently received the United Methodist Women Program Book for 2020-2021, "Knitted Together for God's Good Work", and it's great! The description from the back of the book says: "Knitted Together for God's Good Work explores how we as children of God are joined and linked together into the whole body of Christ. Even at times when social distancing or other obstacles may keep us physically apart, we are knit together in community to transform the world."

From the book's Introduction:

"In spite of things that may try to separate us such as a health crisis, political differences, worship styles, theological differences or even simple misunderstandings, Jesus calls us to be knit together as disciples. How can we work to be the body of Christ working for justice? Where do we see God at work in the world, calling us to join in the work of resisting evil? What practices of faith draw us closer to our companions in Christ?"

The twelve monthly programs explore Biblical passages highlighting the role of unnamed or named women, emphasizing their role in carrying out God's will. They challenge us to join in the courageous, bold witness of faithful women, joining with our sisters in Christ to resist evil and injustice. A new feature this year is called "Knitted Together Virtually". It includes instructions on how to use videoconferencing platforms and gives tips on how to adjust the program activities to use for virtual meetings, which is very helpful for this time. The programs are very well organized with easy to follow directions. The book also includes two special programs – "Pledge to Mission Service 2021" and "A Call to Prayer and Self-Denial 2021".
