AN ADVENT REFLECTION

When you read this it will be well into Advent and you are probably wondering how you will prepare without some of the traditions in your family, friends group or church in this very different year.

I am challenged to look at what it is that prepares me to receive the Gift which God sent because He loves us beyond comprehension. Central to our celebrations, no doubt, is being with others, either our loved ones and friends or with our church family.



How will we receive the Present when we can't be in the Presence of these dear ones?

Gift giving as an expression of our love may be complicated by a reluctance to go shopping. Will your usual gifts of baked items or homemade candy be well received or are some reluctant to eat things from a home kitchen? Would soup or a casserole be more welcome as they will be reheated?

This year our cards and phone calls can have even more impact. As we substitute these for our hugs and get togethers, let's not underestimate how they convey our love and best wishes. I encourage you to go beyond your usual card list. Take out your church directory and see who is likely feeling isolated and lonely. Make a call or send a cheerful note to them.
