



Dear Ijeawele, or a Feminist Manifesto in Fifteen Suggestions

I just finished reading a very short and amazingly easy book to read from the 2019 Nurturing for Community Youth category. It packed a lot of good reading in just 63 short pages. It is written by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie, an author who you may remember wrote one our 2015 Reading List books, Americanah. Adichie is responding to her friend and new mother, Ijeawele's question about how to raise her new baby girl to be a feminist. In 15 suggestions, Adichie gives advice on how to raise strong, independent, capable women.



This is a book that I believe every new mother, every young woman, (and even some of us who fit the older woman age group) should read. I highly recommend it! And it would be a great book for your unit to purchase (I got mine at Amazon for \$6) and share with new women to UMW or for those non-readers in your group.
