### HOUSE OF PROMISE

The Lansing area House of Promise is a new residential facility for women and girls who have escaped from human trafficking.

#### **BACKGROUND**

100,000 girls are taken in the USA a year and it's the fastest growing crime in the world.

Michigan is one of the top 2 states in Human Trafficking.

115-150 young Michigan girls are taken or seduced into sex slavery every month.

The average age is 12 years of age--these are young children.

Shari Montgomery, Director of The House of Promise will speak with us at our September 19, 2018, District meeting. We are asking for financial contributions to support this new resource.


