The Prayer Calendar has a new name and format. Though you can still order a Prayer Calendar book, you can also find it on Face Book. Its new name is <u>Daily Prayer Guide</u>. (Open Face Book, type Daily Prayer Guide in the search bar, and after you have looked it over hit "Like" if it something you would find useful.)

Book Review: <u>Gum Moon: A Novel of San</u> <u>Francisco Chinatown</u>, by Jeffery Staley. This novel (based on a true story) begins in 1898 when a three year old Chinese American girl, Mei Chun Lai, is sold to a cruel brothel keeper, where a sympathetic prostitute befriends her. After she was rescued by a young Methodist woman, she was placed in a home for abused and trafficked girls. To add to this story, the Nov/Dec 2021 Response has an article about this same Methodist shelter that has evolved to serve its San Francisco neighborhood as Gum Moon (meaning golden door) Women's Residence.

We are using the same book list as last year, and it can be found on the UMW site. Eligible books are from 2015-2022.
