SPIRITUAL GROWTH

Thanks to all who attended our Spiritual Growth Retreat in May! Next year's date is May $1^{st} - 2^{nd}$. I hope you will make a note and try to attend.

Our opening prayer at the Spiritual Growth Retreat was: "Heavenly Father, we thank you for today. We want to acknowledge you created us to live in covenant with all that is holy. Help us to be aware of your covenant with us so that we will transform ourselves, our communities and even the world. Help us to model God's covenantal community and work to bring for healing and reconciliation in the midst of pain and suffering."

God made a covenant with Noah in Genesis 9:9-11: "I am now setting up my covenant with you, with your descendants, and with every living being with you—with the birds, with the large animals, and with all the animals of the earth, leaving the ark with you. I will set up my covenant with you so that never again will all life be cut off by floodwaters. There will never again be a flood to destroy the earth."

The covenant includes not only God and Noah's family, but "every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." Realizing the covenant is everlasting and is with all living creatures, we should begin to re-image who our neighbors are. Our definition of neighbor could be expanded to include plants, animals, land, soil, mountains, oceans, and streams.

To be in a covenantal relationship with all of life and also to live a life of wholeness and abundance we need to acknowledge our interconnectedness, especially now when climate change is revealing the global impact of our actions.

The Genesis 9 covenant shows the biblical basis for a theology of creation care. In the biblical view, earth's creatures and species are to be "stewarded" because: God created them; God delights in them; we depend on them; they are part of God's larger plan.

Human beings and the earth continue to be under His care. God is the Creator, and we and the whole earth depend upon Him. Humans are dependent on both God and the earth. On God for life and salvation; on the earth for life in all dimensions including food, oxygen, water and space. Then, the earth and all its creatures depend on humans for their wellbeing and survival.

The Genesis 9 covenant is important today because it reminds us of God's concern for all living creatures. Earth's life forms exist for God, not just for human use or enjoyment. The creatures have their own right to exist and flourish, because they were created by God. They are God's, not ours.

Let us strive to exalt Jesus by honoring His covenant with us. We are called and set apart for the purpose of exalting Jesus. We need to exalt Jesus by keeping him first in our life, extend the gospel by sharing it with others, equip ourselves with the word by growing in the word, exercise our gifts for ministry by serving our church and community, and edify one another by uplifting and enlightening not tearing down.

<u>Philippians 2:9-11</u>: "Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

Remember that you have until the end of December to fulfill the requirements for this year's reading program. This change has come about to put us in sync with the

former West Michigan UMW Reading Program calendar. When we were joined as one UMW, compromises had to be made by both groups. As a result of this change, certificates for the 2019 reading program will not be presented until our District Annual Celebration in 2020.

Some recommendations for good reading:

<u>Threading My Prayer Rug; One Woman's Journey from Pakistani Muslim to American Muslim</u> by Sabeeha Rehman

This is a fascinating first-person account of a woman who made what she thought was a temporary move to the US with her medical-student husband and ended up making a home here. This is well written and it gives a view of arranged marriage that is new for most of us. (Education and Mission)

<u>Eleanor: A Spiritual Biography; The Faith of the 20th</u> Century's Most Influential Woman by Harold Ivan Smith

I thought I knew about Eleanor Roosevelt, but I discovered I knew nothing about how her life and decisions were driven by her spiritual life. "Her personal faith was focused on Jesus and fueled her commitment to civil rights, women's rights and the rights of all people marginalized in American society." (Leadership Development)

The next two recommendations are Youth Books, but still count!

Ahimsa by Supriya Kelkar (Fiction)

Did you know that during India's struggle to gain independence from Great Britain, Mahatma Ghandi asked each Indian family to give one family member to the freedom movement? This is the story of Anjali and the dramatic changes in her life when her mother decides to volunteer. In the course of this story Anjali is forced to make dramatic changes in her own life, for instance learning to accept the "untouchables" as just other humans. (Missions)

Step to the Plate, Maria Singh by Uma Krishnaswami

This is a story of a determined girl's dream to play softball in California during World War II, a time when Indian immigrants could not become citizens or own land. (Her mother is Mexican and her father is from India). Did you know this was a chapter in our history?

I didn't! Maria is a scrappy girl who knows what she wants and works hard to get it, despite numerous obstacles in her way. (Leadership Development)

I enjoy the UMW Reading Program because I learn so much from the books I read; and being required to read books from all categories, I experience books I wouldn't naturally read. Remember, you can try getting these books from your local library (which has interlibrary loan), our own District Library, downloaded on Kindle, or from other books sources.

Next on my reading list is <u>Born on Third Base</u> by Chuck Collins (Social Action) that comes highly recommend by Menominee UMW readers! This book is from last year's list.
