If you send in Special Mission Recognition funds, you need to send an additional form for that as well. That form can also be downloaded from the UMW website. If you aren't able to download and print the forms, I will be happy to send you a copy so that you can make copies for your use.

One other reminder—if you want cards for Gift to Mission or Gift in Memory, you must request them. (Gift to Mission: one card for every \$5 contributed; Gift in Memory: one card per person honored)

This year also marked a transition to a Jan-Dec recording period, and that proved to have some hitches. I received several checks later in December for 2019 contributions. Because this was the first year on the new schedule, I am crediting those contributions to

2019 if they were necessary for your 5-star unit giving. So please remember for this year to send all remittances to me by November 30 in order for them to be credited for 2020. I won't be making allowances for late checks as I did this year.

#### **SPIRITUAL GROWTH**



"Peace"

As the world is now, I'm sure we all think we will never have peace! We have wars and rumors of wars, divisions both near (maybe within our

family) and far (almost the whole world). And, to further point out the bad news, it has been that way since time began.

The good news (Gospel) is God has given us His word in the Bible on how we can have peace. Peace isn't the absence of conflict and peace doesn't just happen – we have to strive for it.

<u>Peace by focusing on God's promise</u> as in Genesis when he promises Abraham a son.

<u>Peace takes priority over conflict</u> as in Numbers when the Israelites turned from Edom (instead of fighting) when the Edomites refused passage through their territory. Or in Joshua when Phinehas was prepared to negotiate rather than fight when the tribes of Reuben, Gad and the half tribe of Manasseh built an altar at the Jordan River. Instead of doing battle right away, he led a delegation to learn the truth and found instead of an altar for heathen sacrifice it was a memorial only.

Making peace can be harder work than waging war but it results not in death but in life and happiness.

<u>Peace through obedience</u> as in Asa's reign told in 2 Chronicles as Asa obeyed God and broke down the foreign idols and high places and did what was right in the sight of the Lord.

<u>Peace from hard work.</u> David explains in Psalm 34:14 to depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it. David said we are to seek and pursue peace since a person who wants peace cannot be argumentative and contentious. Peaceful relationships come from our efforts at peacemaking.

<u>Peace made quickly</u> as Jesus taught when he said when you are offering your gift to the altar and remember your brother has something against you to first be reconciled to them before you bring your gift to the altar; come to terms quickly with your accuser.

<u>Peace within ourselves with confident assurance.</u> Jesus said: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

<u>Peace comes from faith in God</u> because He alone embodies all the characteristics of peace. To find peace of mind and peace with others, you must find peace with God.

Could following these things bring peace to the world? Could it bring peace within a broken family? Could it bring peace to a church facing division?

Sure, these things would! And it would bring peace because it is God's word to us. If peace doesn't happen in the world, we can at least explore these things so we can have peace within ourselves and peace with God. Blessings and peace to you.


