In addition to the NCJ Conference, we enjoyed a tour of the United Methodist Community House (UMCH), one of our United Methodist Women's National Mission Institutions.

## PAST MISSION COORDINATOR OF EDUCATION AND INTREPRETATION Type "Amen" and "Share"

Type "AMEN" and "SHARE": How many of you have read this on Facebook? How many of you receive one or more of these usually sappy 'Christian' sayings daily? Usually with an ominous threat of what abominably nasty thing may happen if you don't pass it along within the next 10 minutes? And the all-knowing "I know who will forward this and who will not." Do you dread them as much as I do? My pastor says he receives them all the time. People assume he's religious so they send them to him and hope he will gain some profound nugget of information worthy of a sermon. Pastor Rich calls them "facetious" and can't wait to hit 'delete!' I wonder how genuine a Type "AMEN" and "SHARE" faith is. So, I also just keep on scrolling down, ignoring the urgent message. I hope my faith shows in other ways.

So, then I started thinking about Jesus and how he was a great communicator. Would Jesus have had a Facebook page? Would he Tweet "Love your neighbor?" Would he use GoToMeeting? Something to think about. Anything to get the message out, but does Type "AMEN" and "SHARE" send the message that we want to be heard? Is the depth and gravity of salvation suitable for a Tweet? Can we condense God's message of love for humankind – that's us! – to 130 characters? Now there's an assignment! (But then again, I've always thought United Methodists could use fewer words!) I'm not advocating ignoring social media. Let's use social media to promote our events and missions, but perhaps reconsider Type "AMEN and SHARE."

Michigan Area UMW owns the property and actively raises funds through membership giving and local church projects to be good stewards of this National Mission Institution (NMI); the only NMI in Michigan.

The ongoing campaign to repair the "house" is called "Special Maintenance Fund Program". It is with grateful hearts that generous giving to this program will result in many completed projects by year end totaling \$66,106.70!

Projects are added to the list for safety, program accreditation, and/or critical repair. This list included two large projects. One, the upgraded heating and cooling system, will be finished soon. One huge and several small projects remain. The job of repairing the rotted structure under the front canopy of the UMCH will be extensive. The approximate total of the remaining projects is **\$93,975**.
