A Pledge to Mission

Have you ever wondered why our financial giving to United Women in Faith is called "Pledge to Mission"?

Our giving to church is often referred to as a "tithe". When I complete my tax return the IRS wants to know my "charitable contributions". During the year I give money to many different organizations, and these are often referred to as donations or gifts. In the on-line thesaurus there are 164 synonyms for "gifting".

A Pledge to Mission is more than just a one-time gift or donation. A Pledge is a solemn promise, it is a serious commitment, not just a casual, spontaneous donation in response to a plea made by a nonprofit organization. It is thought-out, promised, committed. Every year we as individuals, local units, Districts and Conferences make a Pledge to Mission, as we have done for 154 years. Our National Organization of United Women in Faith plans on our pledges to commit support to our nearly 90 National Mission Institutions, our 7 Regional Missionaries, and international missions in over 50 countries including interest-free, micro business loans to women in Sierra Leone to start businesses where traditional financing would carry a 20 -25% interest rate and entrepreneurial women chicken farmers in Zimbabwe who can become economically independent and support their families.

We, as United Women in Faith,

are uniquely positioned to focus on missions that improve the lives of women, children and youth. Our international work empowers women to find local solutions and make positive, measurable change in their communities. This includes skills-building workshops, leadership development, economic empowerment, advocacy work and more.

Our foremothers started down a path of mission that is our legacy to continue today. With our support Isabella Thoburn began a school for girls that became Asia's first women's college and Dr. Clara Swain began work that became the first women's hospital in Asia. Now, 154 years later, both of these institutions continue to serve the women of India today.

So, as we prepare to attend our District Annual meetings this fall, have you personally made your Pledge to Mission yet? Has your local unit considered increasing their pledge so the programs supported by United Women in Faith can keep up with inflation? What are you willing and able to Pledge to continue the work and legacy of United Women in Faith?

Early registration opens September 1 and ends November 30, so we need to identify 2 scholarship recipients soon!




