Social Action

We are currently experiencing several social action concerns this year. All of the concerns are important to me. Not all concerns are listed. I ask that we pray for these concerns.

Haiti Earthquake

Haiti suffered a magnitude 7.2 earthquake on August 14th. Approximately, nearly 1300 are dead and search continues for survivors. This country is going through a lot with the president recently killed. Please pray and support UMCOR.

Climate Justice

A United Nations report said that the earth will reach a critical warming threshold of 1.5 degrees Celsius within two decades and that catastrophic weather events including droughts, floods, fires, and hurricanes will intensify. Global heating is affecting every region of the earth.

In Michigan, this summer we have experience tornados, severe storms, and massive flooding. Some households have experience flooding in their homes, streets, and freeways with every storm. Change is needed now.

Rent Moratorium

July 31, 2021, the Rent Moratorium expired with no action from Congress. All around the country renters stand a chance of being evicted with no place to go. In Michigan, the moratorium is effective through October 3, 2021 but it only covers counties that have substantial or high levels of COVID-19 transmission.

COVID-19 Delta Variant

Delta variant is spreading rapidly in the South and in Michigan. Far more kids are getting sick with COVID-19. A Children's hospital in Dallas Texas are running out of intensive care beds telling parents if you child is sick you will have to wait until another child dies. If you child comes to the hospital needing intensive care, that they will be airlifted to Oklahoma.

This breaks my heart because children under age 12 cannot be vaccinated and the parents make the decisions if they should or should not wear a mask while the virus is spreading rapidly. Are we listening to scientists or politicians?


